OLD TESTAMENT READING

Jeremiah 17:5-8

Blessed is the one whose confidence is found in the Lord! He's like a tree rooted by the water.

⁵This is what the Lord says: "Cursed is the one who trusts in man, who depends on flesh for his strength and whose heart turns away from the Lord. ⁶He will be like a bush in the wastelands; he will not see prosperity when it comes. He will dwell in the parched places of the desert, in a salt land where no one lives.

⁷"But blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him. ⁸He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

EPISTLE READING

1 Corinthians 15:12-20

The message and promise of the resurrection is what matters for us above all things!

¹²But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁴And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. ¹⁵More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that He raised Christ from the dead. But He did not raise Him if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. ¹⁷And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. ¹⁸Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men.

²⁰But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

GOSPEL READING

Luke 6:17-26

Jesus' speaks to His disciples about what truly matters in life.

¹⁷He [Jesus] went down with them [the Twelve disciples] and stood on a level place. A large crowd of His disciples was there and a great number of

people from all over Judea, from Jerusalem, and from the coast of Tyre and Sidon, ¹⁸who had come to hear Him and to be healed of their diseases. Those troubled by evil spirits were cured, ¹⁹and the people all tried to touch Him, because power was coming from Him and healing them all.

Looking at His disciples, He said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied.

Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

Blessed are you when men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man.

"Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their fathers treated the prophets.

"But woe to you who are rich for you have already received your comfort.

Woe to you who are well fed now, for you will go hungry.

Woe to you who laugh now, for you will mourn and weep.

Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is how their fathers treated the false prophets."
